Remember?

10 plus 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, or 9
makes one of the **TEEN** numbers!

10 plus three is thirteen.

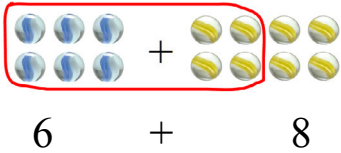
10 plus six is sixteen.

10 plus nine is nineteen.

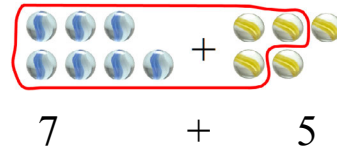
10 plus five is fifteen.

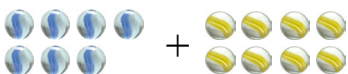


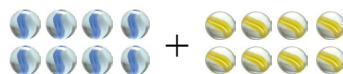
We circle TEN marbles to make a ten. We can now see that there are 10 and 4 marbles. $10 + 4 = 14$. So, $6 + 8 = 14$.

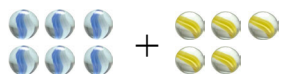


We circle TEN marbles to make a ten. We can now see that there are 10 and 2 marbles. $10 + 2 = 12$. So, $7 + 5 = 12$.

2. First, circle ten marbles to make a ten. How many marbles are there in all?

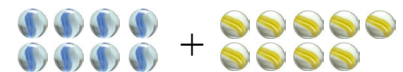

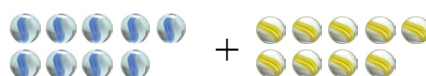
